- → Strengthening the local economy through short & fair supply chains.
- → Promote fairness & equity in agricultural working conditions.
- → Strengthening local networks for participation & shared knowledge.

COMMITMENTS

- Agroecological diversification: promote diversified production systems that integrate crop varieties, animal species, and management practices to reduce dependence on external input, safeguard natural resources, and ensure bio-diversity and resilience.
- Ecological management / Climate resilience: support practices to reduce pesticides and fertilizers, improve soil fertility and resource efficiency, and make farming systems more resilient to the impacts of climate change.
- ▼ Education, training and research: provide opportunities for learning, applied research, and consumer awareness to strengthen the link between production and conscious consumption.
- Social equity and responsibility: promote rights, dignity, and inclusion for agricultural workers and rural communities.
- Agroecological network: connecting farmers, researchers, institutions, and citizens to share knowledge and drive a community-based ecological transition.
